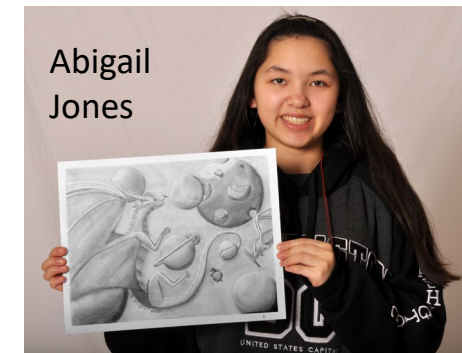
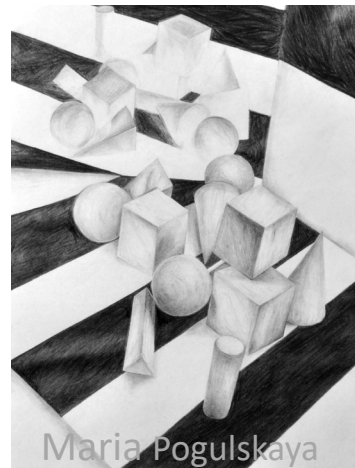
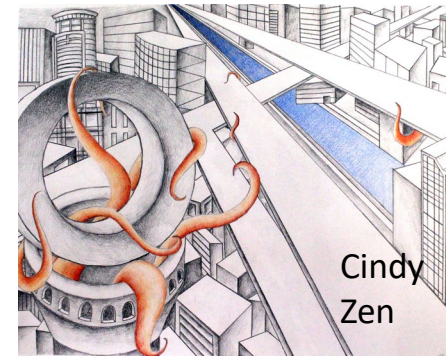
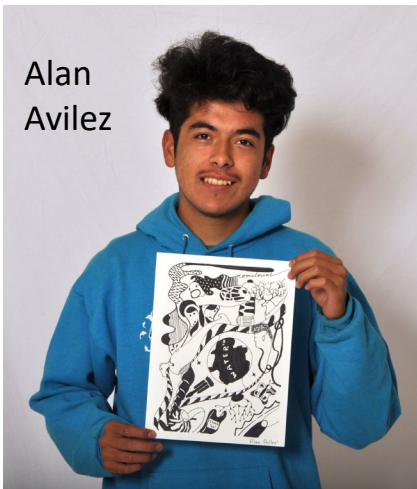


Art 1 – Learn How to Draw

MEDIA: drawing pencils, charcoal, ink, and color pencil

SKILLS: drawing from observation, illusion of form, proportion and perspective, color and value mixing

TECHNIQUES: contour and cross-contour lines, hatching, shading, and blending

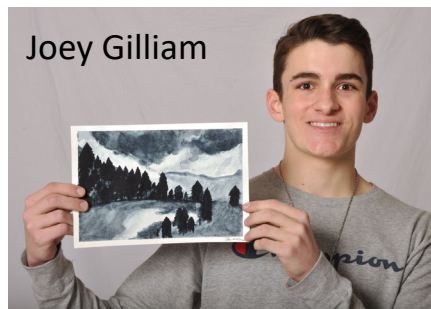


Art 2 – Learn How to Paint

MEDIA: sumi ink, watercolor, and acrylic paint

SKILLS: illusion of form and depth, a sense of proportion and perspective

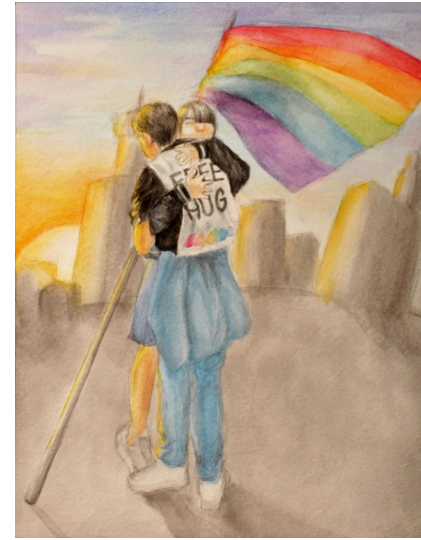
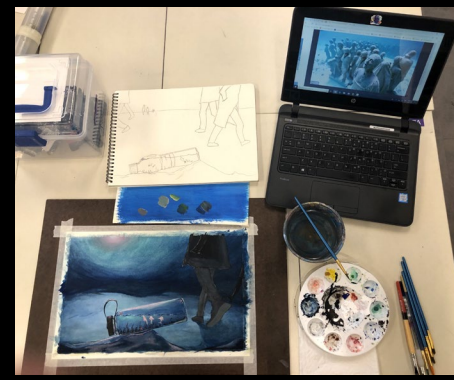
TECHNIQUES: underpainting, texture, dry brushing, washing, glazing and blending

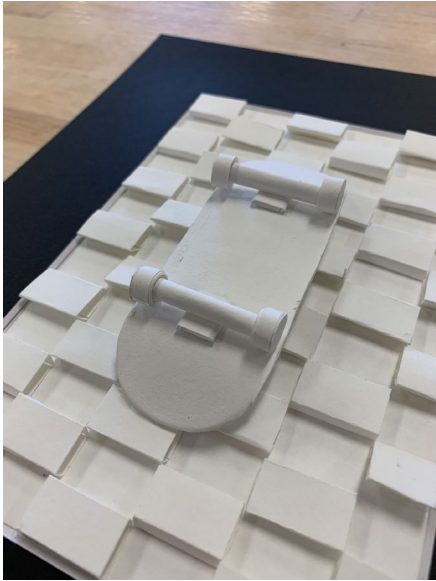

Sculpture 1

- Learn to build in 3 Dimensionality. Gluing, attaching, cutting, creating armatures and structures to build aesthetic sculptures.
- Media: Paper, Cardboard, Foam Carvings, Wire, Found objects and Paints.
- Techniques: Relief, Sculpture in the round, additive sculpting attachments, functional supports and bases, carved reductive sculptures and constructing projects out of raw materials. Experimentation and problem solving to create a 3D object whether aesthetic or functional.

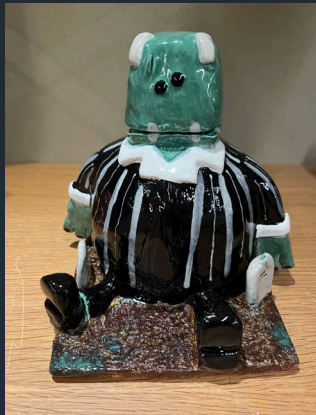

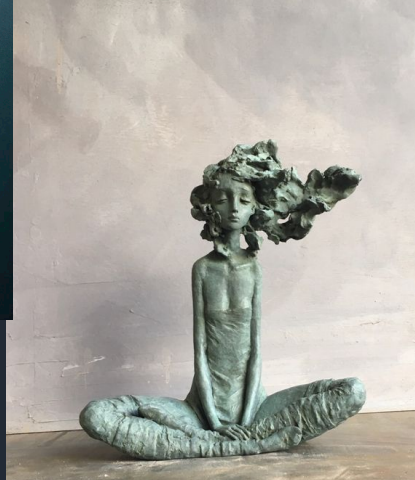

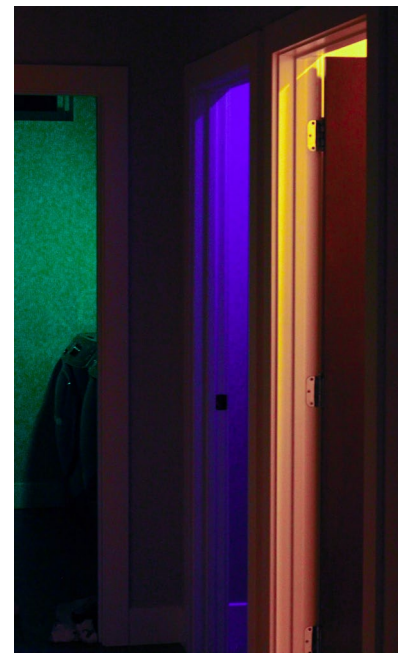
